We are privileged to invite You to the first Litvak Culture Forum in Kaunas, Lithuania on 29th-30th of September, 2022. The Forum, initiated by the Kaunas 2022 programme "Memory Office", will be followed by a varied programme of art events in different parts of the city.

The Patron of the Litvak Cultural Forum is the Prime Minister of the Republic of Lithuania, Ingrida Šimonytė. Honorary Patrons - Prof. Liudas Mažylis and Faina Kukliansky, Chairwoman of the Jewish (Litvak) Community of Lithuania.

Academics, historians, museum professionals, education experts, representatives of the art world, and community members - the Forum will bring together dozens of speakers from various fields and countries. Many of the guests will be visiting the land of their ancestors for the first time - these experiences are crucial in an event that raises the question of what it means to be a Litvak. Other themes of the Forum include culture and art as a key to history and the perpetuation of memory as a way to build a better future and promote openness and dialogue. During the days of the Forum, special musical projects will be presented to the participants and guests at Žalgirio Arena. On 29 September, a concert of Yiddish songs by Marija Krupoves, dedicated to the Jewish memory of the city and the special spirit of Kaunas is scheduled. On 30 September and 1 October, the focus will be on the premier of Kaunas Cantata by composer Philip Miller and artist Jenny Kagan. The Cantata tells the complex story of historical upheaval, the Holocaust, deportations and personal trauma, and the traces it has left in the lives of generations and individuals in the language of music, texts and images. The premiere will be performed by over 200 musicians, the Kaunas Symphony Orchestra, choirs and various ensembles. More information about this event.

IN THE FORUM PROGRAMME YOU WILL HEAR:

Musical performance After Shagal. Composer Anatolijus Šenderovas

Composer Šenderovas said about this work: "Almost 30 years ago, when I was in Jerusalem for the first time, in the Hadassah Medical Centre, in the special hall (synagogue), I saw unusually bright colours on the floor. It was a reflection of Marc Chagall's twelve stained-glass windows mounted high up on the ceiling. They were full of symbols - triangles and circles, imprints of birds, fish, beasts, menorahs and Hebrew letters. A kind of Babylon. However, Shagal's main source of inspiration is the Bible and his own experience. The image kept changing as the sun set. My work is also full of symbols - the clarinet recalls the former Jewish life in Europe, the percussion and the string quartet are like an allusion to the Biblical world."

Šenderovas' work will be performed by the *Chordos* String Quartet, clarinetist Algirdas Žiūra and percussionist Arkadijus Gotesmanas. Šenderovas and Gotesmanas have a long personal creative friendship: especially for this work, Gotesmanas has made a stand that can hold the sounding pieces of stained glass.

A performance of klezmer music by pianist Alexander Paley and clarinetist Karolis Kolakauskas

Pianist A. Paley has been interested in klezmer music for many years. This is the music which was played at weddings and festivals. Over time, it developed into a separate genre of music. Although it seems simple, this music is not easy to play, and improvisation is very important. The musicians will remind us of the life of the Jews of Vilnius, which is no longer...

She will be accompanied by Artūras Anusauskas, violinists Borisas Kirzneris and Vytautas Mikeliūnas, double bassist Eugenijus Kanevičius, accordionist Darius Bagdonavičius, clarinettist Haroldas Parulis, and percussionist Arkadijus Gotesmanas.

"Kaunas Cantata", premiere.

This is a collaboration between two Litvaks - artist Jenny Kagan (UK), composer Philip Miller (PAR) - and many Lithuanian and foreign musicians. It is a conversation about difficult historical traumas and the need to remain silent. The cantata invites us to confront ourselves and encourages us to talk about difficult choices in the face of dramatic events. It is therefore particularly relevant in today's context of war.
